



This is the best Kirby has ever been. Full stop.




Horizon: Forbidden West

The perfect follow-up to an all-but-perfect adventure. This is Kratos at his finest (with some surprises).




Planted

Grow your indoor garden by collecting resources to feed and tend your plants in this beautiful game with amazing components and built-in features to support beginning players.




Boop

We know precious few details and have a ton of unanswered questions. But what little we have seen has us ready to play right now!

Street Fighter 6

Mission Control: Critical Orbit



The team across the globe is needed to save the crew of the Mercury 3 before they run out of air. Mission Control is an asymmetrical play, cooperative, roll and write. Players must accomplish their various roles and tasks to save the crew in a real-time 20 minutes. This fast-paced, frantic game has all the players on the edge of their seats the whole time.

Explosion in the Laboratory

The prequel to the amazing game Fire in the Library. It tells the story of junior chemists trying to find the most interesting and volatile compounds. However, it is risky with the library close by. Explosion in the Laboratory is a push-your-luck micro game with only 27 cards. Players are trying to push the boundaries of compounds, until they push too far and one explodes, ending the round. Just as with the other games from Weird Giraffe Games, there is a solo mode included as well.

Inside Job

Work together as a team of secret agents to complete missions, but look out, there is an insider working to thwart you. Thames and Kosmos took many elements of the wildly popular and award-winning game, The Crew, and added another game mechanic and compelling theme. Inside Job combines cooperative trick taking with a little bit of hidden traitor, as players work to complete their missions and identify the insider who is trying to undermine the team's efforts. ★★



Is a New Switch On the Horizon?

There have been rumors about a “Pro” version of the Nintendo Switch for the last few years. If those rumors are to be believed, then this mystery Switch was going to include more powerful innards and a better looking screen so it could support some of the more demanding third-party games.

Those rumors have not come to fruition though. We have no new Switch. We don’t even have an announcement (or an announcement of an announcement). In fact, some of those same sources have confirmed that the “Switch Pro” is not happening.

What does all that mean for us?

The original Switch was released in 2017 and it was already on shaky ground from a power perspective. It runs using the chips that you would find in tablets (in 2017). It simply cannot keep up with the games being made for the PS5 and Xbox Series S/X. The Switch Lite and OLED version are just revisions and they didn’t add much in the way of power to the console. All of that makes me feel, very strongly, that a new Switch is coming in the next year or so.



If your family is just entering the video game console market and likes to be on the bleeding edge, then I can’t recommend buying a Switch this year. It simply won’t be the top-of-the-line Nintendo console for much longer.



Planescape was originally published as a supplement to Advanced Dungeons and Dragons all the way back in 1994. This was a campaign supplement built around Sigil, the City of Doors, and its innumerable portals to different planes of existence. Each of these planes is themed after either an element (Fire, Water, etc.) or a different Dungeons and Dragons alignment. This leads to adventures that vary widely from moment to moment.

It’s been one of my favorite settings since its release (back when I was in high school) and I am very excited to give it another go. ★★

What exactly is “New” about this game compared to Breath of the Wild?

We know that Tears is set in the same place. (Or at least it looks like it is.) But, we don’t know what game mechanics are returning or leaving. Will we have similar spells to play with like last time? Or will we have a new (Sheikah) slate of abilities to experiment with? Only time will tell.



Weapon Durability

Weapons broke down constantly in Breath of the Wild and it was one of the most divisive features of the entire game. The EFG staff and our kids stand divided on whether or not it was a good thing. This is a chance for Nintendo to respond to fan feedback. Will they put a different weapon system into Tears? Hopefully we find out soon.

What is going on with Link’s arm?

The footage we have seen so far has featured a peculiar pattern on Link’s shoulder and what appears to be a guardian-esque mechanical arm. It sure is interesting to look at, but we have no idea as to the context of the design, or how it will play out in the game. I can’t wait to find out. ★★



Disney is Entering the Collectible Card Game Market




Magic the Gathering, Pokemon, and Digimon have been the kings of the collectible card game space for years. There are other games that have come and gone (Transformers, My Little Pony, etc.) but none of them have stood the test of time. 2023 has a new contender, and it has the best chance of competing with the major players yet.

Lorcana is a Disney-themed trading card game that is being published by Ravensburger. Yes. You read that correctly. A Disney-themed trading card game. You build decks using Disney characters in existing and reimagined art styles and battle it out just like other games currently on the market.

I'm usually very doubtful of new TCGs when they come out. It takes something special to unseat the current champions. Lorcana has something no one else has had so far: the power of the House of Mouse.

You can't keep a trading card game going if the cards sit on store shelves. I don't suspect that will be a problem for Lorcana because Disney collectors are often ... highly motivated. At the end of the day these cards are going to include art for fan-favorite Disney characters which should motivate the Disney fans and keep the game selling well even if the game itself isn't doing well.

With that said, it is being published by Ravensburger. They are a top notch publisher with no shortage of amazing designers. If ANYONE could make something like this work, it is them. ★★
